Philippians 2

The gospel is the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus Subsequent appearances provide evidence of his humanity This is summarized in Phil. 2:5-11

Jesus assumed human form, John 1:1, 14; Col 1:15-17 Jesus became a servant, humbling himself unto death God highly exalted him

Jesus' life was as a human being

He perfectly balanced the dual nature of humanity His death was a human death, Phil. 2

His resurrection was of a human being

1 Cor. 15, his resurrection is promise of our resurrection

Philippians 3

The self-emptying example of Jesus provides an anchor and motivation Paul desires more than anything else to connect himself with and experience this gospel Phil. 3:8-11, Paul's desire to identify with Christ

Phil 3:12-13, Paul's desire to go forward

Phil 3:14-18, barriers to the gospel

Phil 3:19-21, the gospel is our hope

The mission of Jesus' gospel continues in the church Mission of unity
Mission of peace, comfort, hope
Mission of changed lives, imitating Paul
Mission of mutual support
