In some ways, these are symptoms, summaries of deeper problems.

- 1. Individualism, independence, me-ism, lack of interdependence
- 2. Insignificance, only a number, loss of value, loss of worth, esteem problems
- 3. Pride, competitiveness
- 4. Loss of community

The Text of 1 Corinthians 12	Addresses these problems
vv. 1-3, we share a common life	1,2,3,4,7,8,9
4-11, the origin of gifts is not individual	1,2,4,9
7, we have a common purpose	1,2,4
12-14, God desires unity	1,2,4,8
15ff, two principles	
1) we cannot exclude	2,3
2) we must care for all	4

God has constituted the church....

- Vs. 18, that God's will be done requires diversity of abilities
- Vs. 24, the nature of the unity and diversity; the church becomes visible through blending
- Vs. 28, diversity of roles

Lessons (Take-Aways)

- 1. We must continue to emphasize community
- 2. Our gifts and thus our works are from God, vs. 11
 - a. our power is from God, not only our abilities, v. 11
 - b. stewardship means we are stewards of these gifts and abilities
 - c. gifts gives every member significance
- 3. Each member is significant and necessary, v. 22
- 4. Gifts are to be used for the good of the body
