Introduction

- Joyce Landorf (*Balcony People*) says there are two kinds of people: basement people and balcony people.
- An interesting example of balcony people is in the early verses of Hebrews 12.
- All of us know basement people, but such people seldom make any mark in history.
- Do you recognize these names: Palti, Igal, Sethur, Nahbi (prophet), Geuel, Ammiel, Gaddi, Shaphat, Shammua, Oshea (Joshua), Gaddiel, Caleb? These were the 12 spies. Some of the original basement people. "We cannot do it; we are too weak; we are too small."
- Do you know that many parents are basement people to their children? (Dorothy Briggs, Your Child's Self-Esteem)
- All of us have known basement people.
