God Works in a Mysterious Way...

Late July and early August found me working with churches in northern Ecuador with plans to speak at the National Men's Retreat in Colombia the first weekend of August. During the first week in Ecuador (weekend conference, new church plant, and many Bible studies and conversations), I developed a stubborn respiratory infection. A round of antibiotics had no noticeable impact on the infection. Rather than traveling to Colombia to an even colder region, I decided to cancel the second weekend of the trip. The brothers were quite understanding, although I know that my last-minute cancellation required some adjustments since my absence left some empty speaking slots.

I arrived home on Thursday about noon, eager for rest and medication. On Friday, we received word of the death of our granddaughter in a car accident.

(Thank you to those of you who have shared condolences as you received the news. I share here for those who are more distant and may not know about the accident.)

The point I wish to make is that God works in mysterious ways. What wonderful providence that I was already at home and that I was not in the mountains several hours away from my departure airport.

This newsletter will briefly overview May to August activities but focuses primarily on the August mission and mentoring trip to Ecuador.


May to August Activities

During the spring, I had three local teaching obligations. I taught the Wednesday Early Bird class at Park, a Sunday morning adult class at Fort Gibson, and a Spanish class at Fort Gibson. Those concluded by the end of May.

June flew by quickly. I was sick the first week of June. Then the youngest grands visited for a week, and we were without electricity for a week! Along the way, I presented six hours of teaching online about the role and work of the Holy Spirit in the book of Acts (in Spanish, to an online group), and made a mission-focused trip to Arkansas.

The online series of classes on the Holy Spirit concluded in July. Online teaching is a continuing part of the rhythms of my life with about 60 hours of online teaching completed thus far in 2023.

In addition, I continually write, record, and post online teachings in Spanish on Facebook and YouTube. The number of Facebook users in Latin America is incredible! With a total population of about 665 million, about 55% of Latin Americans use Facebook! The potential is great.



Ecuador, July-August 2023



The day I arrived in Ecuador, I began a conference on "the resurrection and eternal life" at the church in Pilanqui. I continued the conference theme in my Sunday morning teaching. Attendance was excellent (pictures above).

A special blessing of this trip was the opportunity to spend some time with the Muenala family (pictures below, Herman and their son Jason; Herman and Aida visiting an elderly member). I was privileged to stay in their home about ten years ago on one of my first trips to this region of Ecuador. That visit and the studies shared resulted in the entire family becoming Christians. When I was a guest in their home, Jason was a baby. Now he is actively involved and leading singing.



And now for the rest of the story!

Sunday afternoon, we conducted a special service for the new church plant in Urcuquí. I preached, taking my

text from the book of Acts and the description of churches planted on Paul's second missionary journey (picture right).

One of the leaders in the new church planting effort is Herman and his family! Many times, especially in international mission efforts, one does not have the blessing of seeing the results of one's efforts!







During my visit, many informal teaching opportunities arose, including a home Bible study which I taught.

- Venezuela, funding for evangelism and benevolence

In addition, the travel-work account is again being funded. Upcoming trips include El Salvador, the Dominican Republic, and Chile, with a possible trip to Honduras.
