Introduction

The title focuses on what energizes me, motivates me, and moves me What works in me? What/who is at work within me? We are freewill instruments. Therefore, I am an instrument. The question is: of whom? The word in the original text, energomai, is the root of our word energy

Two kinds of "works"

The Bible speaks of works of law and works of faith. Law demands work; faith generates works. God's grace leads us to works, activity, actions

Works of faith leads the New Testament Christian to maturity, completeness, perfection

What works within me?

What works within me is, in another sense, "me at work" Consider some of the biblical possibilities--

- The law at work in me
- The flesh at work in me
- The faith at work in me
- Christ at work in me
- God at work in me
- His energy works in me, Col. 1:28, see also Eph. 3:18-21
- God's spirit is at work in me
- Satan can also work in me, Eph. 2:2

Two humanities—which will I follow?

Romans 5:12-21

Me at work = Adam, works of law

Me at work with God = Christ, works of faith

There are two humanities, with whom do I identify?

Having decided to be Christians, we are fellow-workers together

Conclusion

Nothing, no one, works in us without our permission. Who do we let work in us? The word "let" is correct—it is our choice.

We are called to the yielded life, Romans 6

My purpose as a Christian is to bring glory and honor to God

That is the explanation of all of my works and actions
