Sermon Series: Do You Know My Jesus? By Bob Young

Do You Know My Jesus? Mark

Mark describes Jesus as the servant Lord who touches lives with compassion and sensitivity. He describes a misunderstood, betrayed, forsaken, suffering, humiliated, crucified Jesus whose death is both horrifying and shameful. *This Jesus leads us through times of suffering*. Mark also describes a miracle-working, crowd-attracting, debate-winning, authority-wielding, future-predicting *Jesus who leads us to glory*.

Do You Know My Jesus? John

John describes Jesus as the cosmic Lord! He uses descriptive words like the Word, revelation, logic, truth, life, and light. Jesus comes in human form, as the incarnation and embodiment of the God of grace. In this unique description, Jesus becomes the one who *leads us through the battle between conflicting worlds and values*. He is a leader who continues to be present through the Comforter—the Holy Spirit.

Do You Know My Jesus? Matthew

Matthew describes Jesus in terms Jews would know and appreciate. The heart of this gospel is five discourses about life in God's kingdom -- the Sermon on Mount, commission, kingdom of heaven parables, life in kingdom present, and life in kingdom future. Jesus is a king who leads us in real living.

Do You Know My Jesus? Luke

Luke shows us the gospel through Gentile eyes, building relationships with the downtrodden, reversing expectations, and revealing a *Savior who leads us in spiritual relationships*.

Do You Know My Jesus? Acts

How does Luke describe Jesus in his second volume? While he uses many descriptions of Jesus, he basically continues the message of the Gospel of Luke as he describes how Jesus leads us into the world with the power of the gospel message through his Holy Spirit.
